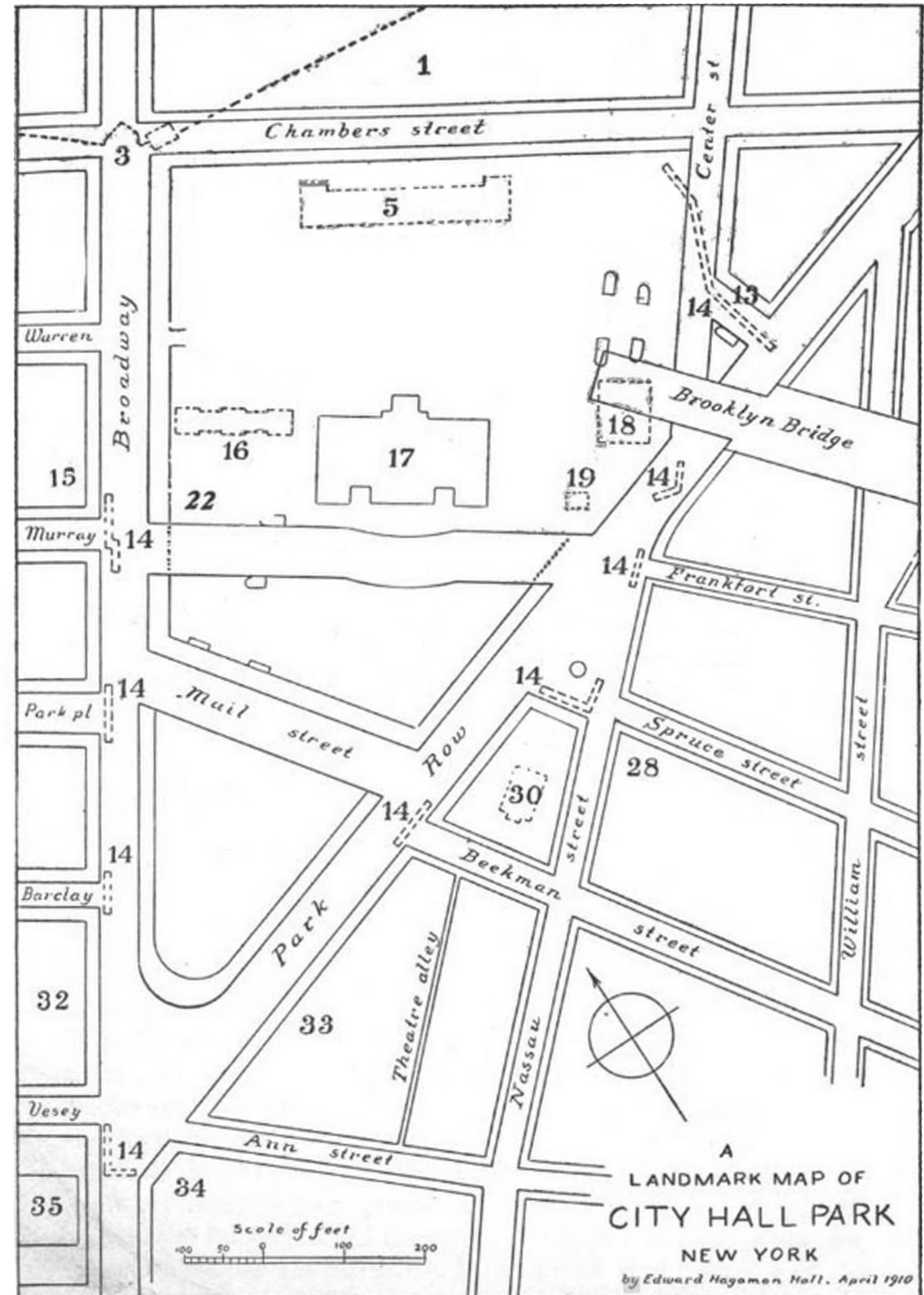


THE COMMON BECOMES THE PARK

1. Site of Ancient burying ground for negros, paupers, criminals and for American patriots under British rule during the Revolution.
3. Site of barrier gate and blockhouse in angle of 2nd city wall of palisades erected in 1746.
5. Plan of 2nd Almshouse 1797 through 1857. Also site of upper barracks 1757 - 1790.
13. Approximate site of old State Arsenal.
14. Fortifications built by Americans in 1776.
15. Site of Montagnie's Tavern, headquarters of Son's of Liberty 1770 and earlier.
16. Plan of Bridewell jail 1777 - 1836.
17. City Hall begun in 1803; site of 1st Almshouse 1736 to 1797.
18. Site of "Martyrs' Prison" of the Revolution.
19. Site of Powder Magazine.
22. Aproximate site of 1st building on the Common, early 18th century
28. Site of Martling's Tavern; frequented by Son's of Liberty and "Martling's Men"; Wigwam of Tammany Society 1798.
30. Site of Brick Presbyterian Church built in 1768.
32. Site of Drovers' Inn and other early hostelries.
33. Site of successive Park Theatres, 1798-1848.
34. Site of Bicker's Tavern, bought by Son's of Liberty in 1770 named Hampden Hall later site of Scudder's Museum and Barnum's Museum
35. St. Paul's Chapel begun in 1764. Site of America's first War Memorial in War for Independence.
